Structured Literacy

Our ākonga will be looking at words that contain the following spelling patterns:

'Er' at the end of words that sound like short/ur/;prefix 'un' meaning not and suffixes -s, -ing, ed, -ly, -er, -est. Ask your tamariki about what they are learning.

READING

Decodable readers support the Structured Literacy programme. Tamariki have also been immersed in reading material linked to the topic eg. Earthworms

WRITING

This term we have re-introduced grammar features to our writing eg. verbs, adjectives etc. Ākonga are also re-reading their writing to eliminate unnecessary mistakes. They also write down facts about non-fiction information that they have read.
